

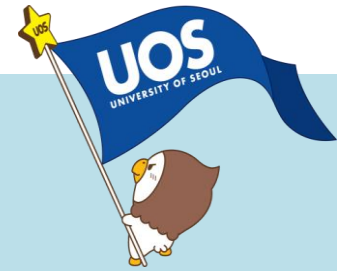

### Taekwondo : Korea's Traditional Martial Art (July 22)

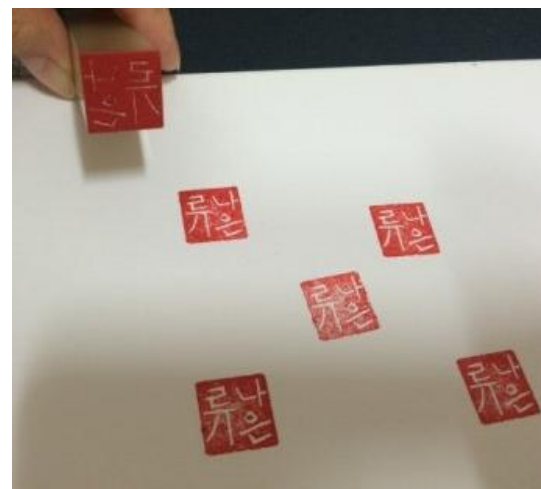

## DIY Korean Name Seal Making (July 22)



### DIY Korean Name Seal (Dojang) Making Experience

Each participant will receive a personal stone seal (1.5 cm × 1.5 cm) and learn the art of Jeongak (Seal Engraving) to carve your own Korean name seal.

### What is Jeongak (Seal Engraving)?

Jeongak is the traditional art of carving characters or designs onto a seal. The term originates from the practice of engraving Chinese seal script (Jeonseo) onto stone, wood, or other materials to create personal stamps and artistic seals.

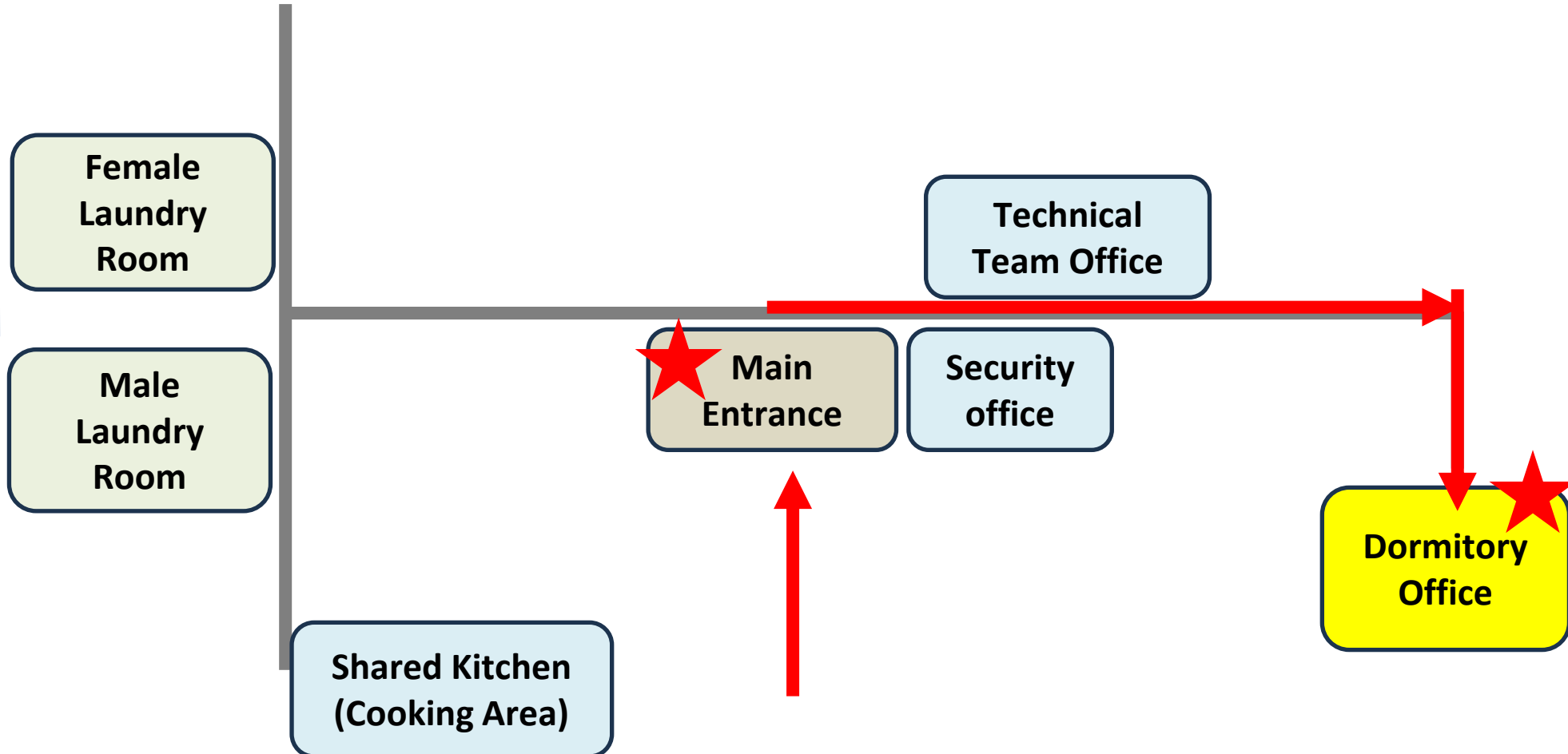

## How to Check-In

### **1. Visit the Dormitory Office**

When you enter the dormitory building, turn right and go straight. At the end of the hallway, turn right again. You will see the dormitory office.

### **2. Register Your Fingerprint at the Dormitory Office**

### **3. Pick up your Bedding (For students who applied for bedding service)**

## How to Enter your Room

- Each house has a door lock (press the password) and each room needs a key to open.
- You can get a room key and a door lock password when you move-in.
- If you lose your key, you need to pay 5,000 won for reissuing a new key.

### How to Enter

- Building 102 : Press the four digit password and press \*.
- Building 103 : Follow the instructions below.



A. Press a metal bar on a bottom.



B. When a two digit number appears, Press the number in order.



C. After pressing two numbers in order, the keypad will show up. Then, press the four digit password and press \*
